'Shout!': songs that made England swing

NEW YORK - The songs helped make England swing in the 1960s - "To Sir With Love," "Downtown," "Goldfinger," "Son of a Preacher Man," "You Don't Have to Say You Love Me" and more.

They were sung by such iconic performers as Petula Clark, Lulu, Dusty Springfield, Cilla Black and Shirley Bassey. And those numbers, along with the era's fashions, hairstyles and dances, are the focus of "Shout! The Mod Musical," which looks at five young women growing up in that turbulent decade.

"Shout!" opens July 27 at the Julia Miles Theatre, 424 W. 55th St. Preview performances begin July 11. Before New York, the show, created by Phillip George and David Lowenstein, will play the Raymond F. Kravis Center for the Performing Arts in West Palm Beach, Fla., June 9-July 2.
